

Public Service

The MS150 has come and gone for another year. It was a great weekend for both the riders and volunteers. The weather was overcast and there was a slight tailwind for most of the day on both Saturday and Sunday. The ideal riding conditions and the MS Society's emphasis on safety training and training rides for the participants paid off with a ride that was free of serious injury. There were the expected cases of road rash, dehydration and fatigue treated on the side of the road and a few were transported to local hospitals by medical transport vans or ambulance for injuries that were treated and released but there were no heart attacks or serious head, back or neck injuries requiring Life Flight as in years past. The SAG vans even had a relatively light duty weekend as most of the riders rode the whole route on their bikes instead of in the vans. There was some malcontent who scattered tacks along the roadway on Saturday and caused a rash of bike tire flats. This kept the SAG people, motorcycle escorts and bike repair people busy for a few hours.

Jeff Walter, KE5FGA, Richard Driscoll, KD5URB, Ken Mitchell, KD2KW, Bill Rimmer, N5LYG and a few other ARES members initiated a new traffic control program in the rest stops to smooth the flow of bike and SAG van traffic into and out of the rest stops. With the ride getting larger each year and the rest stops staying the same size, traffic in them is a nightmare. ARES could use some more help with this program next year.

NARS had another good turnout of volunteers this year. A couple of the regular participants from past years could not go this year but we picked up a couple of new faces too. Mark Tyler, K5GQ and Virgil Stamps, K5OOR, went for their first ride this year. Also, Paul Owen, N5NXS, Tom Atkins, KD5EIJ, Jeff Walter, KE5FGA, Ken Mitchell, KD2KW and yours truly, K5ZTY, made up the NARS team. Mike Hardwick, N5VCX, the President of BVARC and Communications Coordinator for the MS150 did a remarkable job of covering the necessary communications needs of this enormous moving event that stretches out for approximately 60 miles with fewer hams than he had last year. The following is from the ARES E-Letter of April 18, 2007.

Opinion: TSA Wants Staffers as Amateurs

I think we are seeing an increase in the speed with which our federal government is formally adopting Amateur Radio as their supplemental and backup communications service, and their intent to use government employees as the primary operators. The camel has more than his nose under the tent.

From an ARES EC who attended a Houston, Texas, Amateur Radio club meeting Monday night April 9: "We had an unusual guest at the ECHO [Society} meeting tonight. The 'Assistant Federal Security Director' for the TSA, as in Homeland Security, was there gathering assistance and information on establishing training, licensing and mentoring TSA employees to get their ham tickets. It would appear that they are setting up HF/VHF stations at all 27 key Gulf Coast airports."

On March 28, Army MARS conducted a regional communications exercise with stations operating at the Houston and Dallas-Fort Worth airport TSA offices, FEMA Region 6 HQ in Denton, Texas, Texas state operations center in Austin, and 5th Army HQ in San Antonio. This EC's report hints at TSA's Amateur Radio infrastructure and resource expansion beyond the Army MARS-TSA agreement. Perhaps TSA recognizes the limited Army MARS resources and facility access obstacles. -- Jerry Reimer, KK5CA, SEC South Texas
