


April Meeting

Sunspots and Propagation

When I (KD5EIJ) first earned my technician license, sunspot activity was in full swing. I spent about a year terrorizing DX operators on the 10 meter band and enjoyed every moment. It was a great time for new operators and I filled the pages of my log book and collected QSL cards from all over the world. Unfortunately over the next few years the sunspot activity died down as expected and propagation changed.

The average duration of a sunspot cycle is about 11 years, but cycles as short as 9 years and as long as 14 years have been observed. It appears we are still near the bottom of an odd year number cycle and recovery is painfully slow. Sunspot activity is on the upswing and a few flares have been observed, but a full scale recovery is not in the cards at this point in time. Will propagation improve; sure it will but when is anybody's guess. Significant



variations in amplitude can also occur. Solar maximum and solar minimums change from cycle to cycle and solar indexes swing from good to bad. That means even though activity is improving we have no guarantees that we'll have the type of propagation we're hoping for.

So why is it taking so long for propagation to improve. Ever wonder what really happens when a radio wave hits the ionosphere? What is the ionosphere? How high is it? What keeps it ionized? HOW DOES it carry the signal to DX-land? How does it depend on the frequency? How does it depend also on the take off angle? What happens to the signals that don't come back? What happens to the ionosphere during high Solar activity, and how does it affect 10 meter signals so much when Sunspots are plentiful? What allows QRP to make it around the world? What happens to 160 meter signals during the daytime? Does the ionosphere "reflect" or "refract" HF? What causes rhythmic QSB? What about VHF/UHF? What are the floating mountains of Big Bend and how do they relate to this? We're going to talk about all of that, and more. You will be amazed by some of the answers. Get ready for some user-friendly but very real science! This program content will be "100% Wikipedia free." See you Friday! (KD5EIJ/K5END)


