

Amateur Radio Aboard the USS Texas NA5DV

The annual "Museum Ships Weekend" which fell coincidentally on D-Day this year was a new experience for me. The man sitting to my right logging contacts is Frank Cooper of BTARS and the Trustee for NA5DV. The Radio Room itself is one deck below, and is still under restoration. Once restoration is complete, they will use the ship's radio for these events.

I'm told the USS Texas is the only remaining dreadnought in the world, and only one of two ships still around that served in both World Wars. The USS Texas was at Omaha Beach on D-Day, at the Iwo Jima invasion, and at the Okinawa invasion. Like any good Texan, She has a history of which we can be proud. I felt very privileged to operate from this historic warship, especially given that it was the anniversary of D-Day and She is docked at the San Jacinto Battleground of 1836.
