Thanks to a lot of planning and leadership from key NARS members this years Field Day activities were a roaring success. Congratulations to all the team captains and thanks for all the efforts.

I've heard people say the days of amateurs building and using their own equipment are a thing of the past. And I guess for the most part that's a true statement but not totally true when it comes to NARS. If you look around and pay attention you'll see a lot of homebrew gear being used at Field Day. Look up you'll see homebrew wire antennas and not just one antenna but one for each station. How did those antennas get up in the tops of those trees? A homebrew W5MMX antenna launcher was used to launch the support lines used to raise the wire antennas. We have homebrew K5ZTY band pass filters used to keep the CW team and the Phone team out of each others radios when the antennas are in close proximity. Pretty neat don't you think? Take a look at the radios in the CW tent and you'll find a K2 transceiver assembled by Chuck NO5W. And did you notice that power supply setup? NARS Total Score: QSO Points + Bonus Points = 6982

The 2010 score compares quite favorably with our score of 4308 from 2009. We still have room for improvement in order to achieve our score from 2005 which was 10,140 and resulted in fifth place in class 2A.

The obvious thing that we need to do in order to return to the 2005 level is to increase QSOs made by the stations. This is somewhat within our control, but also depends on the number of stations participating in Field Day, and on propagation conditions.

The NARS total score noted above is a preliminary score in that it has not yet been submitted to ARRL. Submission is planned before the July club meeting. <u>no5w@consolidated.net</u>
