November Meeting

Fire Safety in The Home and How Amateur Radio Works with The Fire Department and EMS

This month General meeting topic will be a presentation by Ponderosa Fire Chief Fred Windisch. He will be discussing fire safety in the home and how Ham radio fits in with the fire department and EMS in the northwest part of Harris County.

Fred Windisch serves as the Fire Chief of the Ponderosa FD in north Harris County. Ponderosa serves 50,000 people in a 13 square mile area. Fred is retired from Shell Oil's research division after 30 years and was the facility's fire chief. Fred worked his last 13 years in the Health, Safety and Environment department. Chief Windisch recently chose not to run for re-election to the Board of Directors of the International Association of Fire Chiefs after 11 years, and he still serves on the IAFC's Volunteer and Combination Officers Section Board of Directors. He has been a member of Ponderosa FD since 1975. Fred co-authored a book A Leadership Guide for Combination Fire Departments and has written numerous articles related to leading volunteer and combination agencies.

This should be a very interesting meeting.

Saturday Nov. 20th

The FM 1960 Area Emergency Communication Center was formed and began operation in 1984 at the Sugar Pine Lane location. At this time 8 departments owned this till 1996 when Cypress Creek EMS bought out the remaining 7 department shares. It was decided that the Sugar Pine out grew its capacity and a new facility was built from the ground up. This is now located on Five Forks just off Stubener Airline and went on line in April 29th 2010. It houses a full ham station plus all of the other communication equipment and has a 200 foot tower.

Nars has made arrangements to visit the location on Saturday Nov. 20th at 9:00 am after the Nars Saturday breakfast at Denny's. Come and see how the new EMS system works.

NARS & Salvation Army Red Kettles

In 1891, Salvation Army Captain Joseph McFee was distraught because so many poor individuals in San Francisco were going hungry. During the holiday season, he resolved to provide a free Christmas dinner for the destitute and poverty-stricken. He only had one major hurdle to overcome -- funding the project.

Where would the money come from? How could he find the funds to fulfill his commitment of feeding 1,000 of the city's poorest individuals on Christmas Day. As he pondered the issue, his thoughts drifted back to his sailor days in Liverpool, England. He remembered how at Stage Landing, where the boats came in, there was a large, iron kettle called "Simpson's Pot" into which passers-by tossed a coin or two to help the poor.

The next day Captain McFee placed a similar pot at the Oakland Ferry Landing at the foot of Market Street. Beside the pot, he placed a sign that read, "Keep the Pot Boiling." He soon had the money to see that the needy people were properly fed at Christmas.

Six years later, the kettle idea spread from the west coast to the Boston area. That year, the combined effort nationwide resulted in 150,000 Christmas dinners for the needy. In 1901, kettle contributions in New York City provided funds for the first mammoth sit-down dinner in Madison Square Garden, a custom that continued for many years. Today in the U.S., The Salvation Army assists more than four-and-a-half million people during the Thanksgiving and Christmas time periods.

This is the 4th year that NARS has rung the bells for the Salvation Army Red Kettles. Our location is the Wal Mart store at Spring Cypress & 249, December 4th, 10 am to 5 pm in 1 hour shifts. Public contributions to Salvation Army kettles enable the organization to continue its year-round efforts at helping those who would otherwise be forgotten. This year we have all of the time spots fill except the emergency back ups for reasons that a volunteer can't make it. I have openings for 2 persons to fill this requirement.
