
No, NARS is not contemplating an increase in dues. What we are looking at is cutting expenses without compromising our charter. Operating expenses can place a strain on anyone's budget. Remember when the NARS News went electronic? Many of us thought a hard copy was the only way to keep its membership informed. We saved a ton of money by eliminating printing and postage costs, going to e-mail and utilizing our web site more efficiently. Now, except for a few hard copy mail-outs to some that have limited avenues of communication, the change has worked quite well.

But postage costs continue to raise its ugly head. Come January 2012, the first class stamp increases to 46 cents. Membership renewals are now our biggest postage cost. Each month a renewal notice is sent out to members on their membership anniversary date. Why not try e-mail? Well, it works for newsletters and general communication, but most folks tend to minimize the importance in paying a bill received via electronic media. It's easy to forget once you shut down your computer or smart phone. Direct mail seems to work better, for now. However, acknowledging a renewal is important too. You now receive the latest copy of the NARS membership roster and a notice thanking you for your

continued support. Here's where we think we can save a few bucks. Where possible, your renewal will be acknowledged via e-mail with the membership roster attached. Redd School LABRATS Radio Club 2012

The new school year has begun and the LABRATS Radio / Electronics Club is setting a new direction with middle school students who want to learn about radio and electronics.



The students in this chose this group program as an elective, part of their regular school instruction.. They were required to sign a school contract promising to follow rules to complete this course safely as they perform activities on electrical theory: circuitry and learning skills such as soldering.

Our first building project is a Code practice Oscillator and the start of learning the Morse Code (CW). Oh

yes there will be a test! The students will also get airtime on the club radio station W5LAB and learn the fundamentals of making a contact with other hams.

The station has a 2 element Yagi for 10m, 15 m, & 20m, 40m inverted V, and a 2m vertical, all about 25 feet up.

Our club name is LABRATS (Learning ABout Research And Technology through Science), and the Radio component has been an integral part of this umbrella project since 2004 when Mrs. "Lollie" Garay started the program.
