# VP8THU South Sandwich DXpedition

The February club meeting will be the showing of the award winning VP8THU South Sandwich Islands DXpedition video.



Described by Captain James Cook as the most horrible place on Earth, the South Sandwich Islands are also one of the most logistically difficult places for a DXpedition. Using only 100 watts and verticals, this experienced team took on the South Atlantic's tough environmental challenge by heading to Southern Thule - the planet's most southerly piece of land outside the Antarctic Treaty Zone.

Operating within the remains of an old Argentine base, (and amongst 100,000 penguins!) this video documents how a super-lightweight expedition set out to bring back the fun of old-time DXpeditions!

## President's Corner

#### VE Session Notice

This new year is off to a hustling, bustling start. We are planning for FD now, and all of the contact parties that we normally participate in.

A new effort on our plate this year. In January, NARS received a donation of two towers, four+ antennas, lots of aluminum parts, a TS-120 and a power supply. The misc parts are a pick up full of stuff and a stake bed load or two of towers and large antennas. The task for us is to sort through all of this and repair what needs to fixed and mark all of the remainder for a future sale. The biggest item is a self supporting crank up tower that is in need of cable replacement and testing. This tower is top quality and very heavy. It is a 55 foot crank up and it has a rotor and thrust bearing that need to serviced. The two best antennas are a Hy Gain TH-7DX, 19, 15, 20 meters bands, and a Cushcraft XM240 40 meter 2 element Yagi. These are excellent antennas and they are large and heavy when assembled. The other antennas are dissembled and may not be complete, but they are quality units. This is a real treasure trove and we are fortunate that a very senior Ham decided to donate them to NARS.

The second tower is in sections and we have cable for guy wire supports and ground anchors. It is larger in size than Rohm 25 and not quite as large as Rohm 45. It is very solid. This antenna is about 60 feet tall depending on which top section is used. We are thinking that we will use this tower in sections for our FD towers. We could make two towers out of this one for NARS FD of the future.

We need your help to make all of this happen. If I could get some indication from those of you that are interested in helping with this effort, I will arrange for an antennae party or several as the need may dictate.
