In less than two short months, the H44IOTA DXpedition will be in full swing with a total of seven stops in the historic Solomon Island Archipelago, culminating in the activation of the Virgin IOTA, OC-085 (Stewart Island).

The DXpedition Team is in place, the equipment is ready and we are ready to launch.

You can also get onboard!

This DXpedition is a vehicle for the operation of the Pacific C3 Project which aims to actively seek dialogue with island communities in the Pacific, and directly assist where possible by establishing Connections, Communication networks, and Co-ordination with other Pacific activities.

In keeping with this aim, the Pacific C3 Project will be installing a VHF inter-island linkage system that will provide marine safety to the skippers and passengers of the canoes that travel in and around Nendo Island OC-100, in the Temotu Province of H40.

Who better than the amateur radio community to support and sponsor this project!
