Field Day is in planning stages. The board has considered a couple options this year and has brought those options before the general meeting for discussion and decision on direction we will take. Option #1 we have reserved the Burroughs Park. This means all activities will be outdoors rain or shine. Option #2 utilize our current Club meeting location at the Klein Fire Department HQ Building. In the general meeting the vote was to request approval from Klein Fire Department to use this meeting facility for our Field Day operations. I met on April 8<sup>th</sup> with the Harris Co. ESD No. 16 Commissioner's at their regular board meeting to discuss the details of having a NARS sponsored Field Day activity at the Klein Fire Department HQ Building. I received overwhelming approval from the Commissioner's and so we will move forward in our planning of this event. I want to say on behalf of NARS Officers and membership a very special thankyou to Commissioner Mike Pate (and NARS board member) for helping us gain the approval to hold this event.

Field Day is always a popular event with NARS members. This event is open to the General Public and ALL amateur radio operators. The Coordinator for Field Day this year is Larry Hill. He is looking for volunteers to assist in planning. We need a team to provide leadership for the CW, phone and GOTA stations. It would also be nice to have someone set up a station to communicate via satellite. These activities need support from others good at providing power and antennas. If you have an interest in any of these FD activities, be ready to join the coordinator in planning FD. Also, consider being the coordinator. You will gain valuable information and experience. Keep an eye on the reflector as more information will be released over the next few weeks.

<u>Club Repeater.</u> We have heard your concerns and after several months of pondering options and planning a course of action, **The NARS 146,66 - 141.3 repeater is back on the air!** Our NARS Motorola Repeater however needs repair or replacement. The good news is the H.A.M.S. (Houston Amateur Mobile Society) group has given us a loaner.

This what we found with the NARS repeater:

- Repeater had a "Failed Rx" light on and the "Tx Lock" was off.
- Antenna was broken in the middle and unusable.
- The coax (Hardline) had a failed splice.

These items were fixed and H.A.M.S. (Houston Amateur Mobile Society) loaned us a repeater which is now operational and sounds good.
